You are starting AMGEVITA®, this medicine is used in children to treat a type of arthritis (sore joints) also skin, eye and tummy problems.



How is it given?

Your medicine is given as an injection by a nurse, doctor or a parent/carer that has been trained to give you the injection.

How often do I need to do this?

Your doctor may need to try different medicines to make you feel better. As soon as you start to feel better, you can hopefully go back to the things you enjoy.




